RC Street Repair

"Repair work is underway on city streets," says Dr. Martin Moore, Rio Communities City Manager. "We have completed repair work on various streets, with a list of additional streets scheduled for either pothole repair or partial replacement throughout the months of June, July, and August. Due to the number of potholes that require repair, the City is contracting with paving companies to do the work.

"Price estimates for pothole repairs are expected to be completed around June 1, 2021. Work is expected to begin the first full week of June.

"As street work starts in different areas of the city, we will make every effort to inform residents in those areas through social media and our city website." adds Dr. Moore.

Do You Know Building Permits?

Many homeowners are self-proclaimed handymen who feel capable of building almost anything; after all, construction is not metaphysics and with the internet, especially You-Tube, there's a seemingly inexhaustible source of instructions and how-to videos.

So, when faced with home maintenance or improvement projects, how do homeowners know if a building permit is necessary? Following, is guidance that should prove useful answering this question.

What is a Building Permit? Simply stated, a building permit is required for many home and all commercial construction or remodel projects to ensure safety and compliance with current local building, construction and zoning codes.

When do I need a Building Permit? Generally, a building permit is required when constructing a new home or building, adding rooms, or remodeling that involves demolition, and certainly when repairing or installing new mechanical, electrical or plumbing.

Projects that most likely require a permit are those that change the structure or use of a building or have the potential to create a potentially unsafe condition. Examples:

- Adding or removing walls,
- Changing the use of a room (e.g., converting a garage to
- a living room),
- Changing the piping (mechanical or plumbing) in your house,
- Replacing a roof to include decking,
- Demolishing a portion of your house.

Projects that typically don't require a permit include:

- Repainting your house,
- Adding kitchen cabinets,
- Replacing certain kitchen appliances,
- Repaving your driveway,
- Installing new floor coverings,
- Erecting a small fence, or

• Building a storage shed that is less than 120 square feet.

For specific exceptions where a building permit is not required, see Chapter 7 (Building and Construction), Section 2 (Inspections), Article 3 (Permits), Paragraphs A-D or 7-2-3(A) (B)(C)(D) at https://www.riocommunities.net

How do I get a Building Permit? Contact the Municipal Clerk at 505 861-6803 to inquire about a building permit, or stop by City Hall, Monday thru Thursday, 9 a,m. to 3 p.m. at 360 Rio Communities Blvd. Or after 3 p.m. by appointment.

How much does it cost? A typical building permit will cost \$75.

The City of Rio Communities does not issue the actual permit, rather your request is reviewed for compliance with flood-plain criteria, existing setbacks, right of ways and clear line of sight. The actual permit is issued by the office of Construction Industries Division (CID) in Albuquerque. The City Clerk will provide details on this process.

Finally, it's important to know that failure to acquire a permit for a project, may result in the project being demolished, especially if it does not meet current construction codes.

Best advice... when in doubt, call City Hall.

Tentative Budget Adopted

After three months of hard work, the City of Rio Communities Council has adopted its Fiscal Year 2021/2022 budget.

"We are very pleased to have a balanced budget that increases services to our residents," says Peggy Gutjahr, Mayor Pro Tem of the City of Rio Communities. "This budget includes a ¼ cent increase in the Gross Receipt tax rate and over \$2 million dollars in grant funds. This increase helps the city balance the budget while providing the following additional services."

- a dedicated, trained code enforcement officer;
- two (2) emergency medical personnel to improve weekday response to medical calls for service;
- an increased presence of law enforcement with a focus on improved targeting of problem areas and traffic safety;
- confirming the location, designing, and completing the city's first recreational park;
- completing over \$1 million dollars worth of additional street improvements;
- adding new street lights in strategic areas throughout
- using the city's storm water drainage plan to start designing flood improvement projects; and
- attracting new housing and businesses to the City of Rio Communitieš.
